YEAR 10 COURSES

In Year 10, all students take the core subjects (English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Physical and Health Education). They also choose up to four option subjects. Year 10 students take:

<u>either</u>	2 full year options
<u>or</u>	1 full year option <u>and</u> 2 half year options
<u>or</u>	4 half year options

Full Year Options: Chinese, Spanish, Maori, Music, School Services Academy.

Half Year Options: Art, Digital Technology, Food Technology, Design and Visual Communication, Materials Technology, Drama, Investigative Geography, Ancient Civilisations.

A brief outline of the option subjects is given below.

HOW ARE YEAR 10 CLASSES ORGANISED?

Year 10 students study the core subjects (English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies and Physical and Health Education) with their Form Class. The options classes are made up of students from across Year 10 who have chosen the same subject. This marks the start of the transition to the Senior School where students no longer have lessons in Form Classes.

ASSESSMENT

Students complete tests and assessments throughout the year in the core and option subjects. We use students' assessment results to help us decide where to place students in Level 1 English, Mathematics and Science. The results, along with those from the options subjects, determine if students have gained their Junior Diploma and at what level, i.e. Distinction, Excellence, Merit or Achieved.

IF I WANT TO TAKE A SUBJECT IN YEAR 11 DO I HAVE TO DO IT IN YEAR 10?

The short answer is no. However, some Year 11 subjects, such as Chinese, Spanish and Te Reo Maori, will be easier if you have studied them in Year 10.

IMPORTANT

We use the students' initial choices to construct the timetable for the next year. Then, in Term 4, we ask the students to confirm their options choices based on next year's timetable. Although we do our very best to create a timetable that enables as many students as possible to take the combination of subjects they want, we cannot guarantee that everyone will be able to do so.

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FULL-YEAR OPTIONS

MUSIC – 10MUS

This course gives students the opportunity to develop their music making skills in preparation for the Level 1 Music courses. Students will gain skills in solo and group performance, learning to read and play music, techniques specific to their instruments, composing skills, style studies and listening. These skills will be developed in and through a range of musical contexts and topics of study. Home practice is required as there will be opportunities throughout the year to perform in front of an audience.

Students must be enrolled in itinerant instrument lessons throughout the year as part of the course requirement. Itinerant Music Programme \$25.00

Course Cost: \$20.00 for headphones (student may provide their own).

SPANISH – 10SPA

Spanish is an intensive course covering all the elements of learning that will enable the student to confidently enter NCEA Level 1 after two years. Students are challenged to develop aptitude in speaking, listening to, reading and writing Spanish. They also learn about the customs, history and culture of Spain and Spanish speaking countries.

CHINESE – 10CHN

Chinese is an intensive course which prepares students for NCEA Level 1 in two years and leads to higher study. At this level, students will learn and use familiar expressions and everyday vocabulary to interact in supported situations. Students will gain an understanding of a major Asian culture through both written and oral language.

MĀORI – 10MAO

A course extended from Year 9 level and leading on to NCEA Level 1, 2 and 3. Students will need to have a genuine interest in this area and the subject can lead to a wide range of career opportunities, e.g. tourism, nursing and teaching. Aspects of art, culture and both written and oral language will form the basis of the programme.

SCHOOL SERVICES ACADEMY – 10SVA

Trainees will develop life skills and values that will support them as they grow and continue to learn. This programme will develop and instil within the trainee the ability to self-manage, through being aware of personal and physical well-being, cultural interaction, team spirit and the common military bond of courage, commitment and integrity. Students study:

- NZDF and NZ Cadet Force history and traditions
- Problem solving
- Time management
- Self-management
- Physical training
- First Aid
- Military drill, attitude and discipline

Students can achieve up to 25 NCEA Level 2 credits as part of the Cadet Forces Foundation Skills programme.

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HALF-YEAR OPTIONS

ART – 10ART

This half year course builds on the Year 9 course and encompasses a range of activities – drawing, painting, mixed media, printmaking, and is useful for NCEA Level 1 Art. Costs include material fee and Art Kit - \$30.00

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY – 10DTE

This half year course introduces students to the key components of Digital Technology. Students will work on projects that encompass design, digital media, coding, 3D Modelling. A wide range of software packages will be used including: Adobe Creative Cloud, Blender, Microsoft Office 365, and Scratch. Some software is free and can be installed on students' laptops at no charge. The other software is available on the school's computers, but can be purchased at a discounted rate through the school.

FOOD TECHNOLOGY – 10FNT

This option is a must for any student interested in food and all that this encompasses. If you are interested in working in the hospitality industry, becoming a chef, owning your own restaurant or café, learning more about food and nutrition, developing new products and gaining some important life skills, this is the option for you. A range of interesting topics are covered including nutrition, international foods, food safety and hygiene and product design and development. Students will have the chance to complete a Level 1 Unit Standard in baking which can earn them 3 credits toward NCEA next year. This subject gives a good grounding for Year 11 Home Economics.

DESIGN AND VISUAL COMMUNICATION – 10DVC

This is a concentrated course teaching the use of graphics and formal drawing skills including plane and solid geometry, engineering drawing, architectural drawings and visual communication skills. The course includes project design and basic working drawings produced using problem solving skills taught through the use of the Design Process. It provides a good grounding for the Level 1 NCEA Design and Visual Communication (Graphics) course.

HARD-MATERIALS TECHNOLOGY – 10THM

This course has a strong emphasis on practical work. It suits those students with a vocational interest in engineering, building or woodwork. Students will carry out 'design and make' tasks, the first project will be constructed from wood. In the second, students will make a sheet metal tool-box. The nature of this course is similar to a traditional wood/metal work course and leads to the NCEA Level 1 Unit Standards course.

DRAMA – 10DRA

In this course students will be able to link their own imaginations, thoughts and feelings with drama practice and history in many different ways. They gain knowledge about theatre, theatre forms, and drama's contribution to social and cultural commentary. They learn drama techniques which contribute to their assessments, all of which are performed in front of a live audience. Some Level 1 NCEA Achievement Standards are offered in this course.

INVESTIGATIVE GEOGRAPHY – 10GEO

This half year course introduces students to learning about the natural and cultural environments in our local landscape. Global Issues will be investigated such as the geography of disease, population problems and megacities. Navigation skills will be a key focus with an introduction to using GPS and GIS technology. Field work, practical work and assessment will be completed in collaborative learning groups. This course will help any students wishing to take Level 1 Geography.

Course Cost: \$25.00 for a fieldtrip (optional but recommended).

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ANCIENT CIVILISATIONS – 10HIS

This half year course will offer students the opportunity to study the cultures of some of the world's ancient civilisations. These include the Ancient Mesopotamians, the Ancient Greeks, the Ancient Romans and the Ancient Egyptians. These civilisations provide some of the most interesting opportunities for students to explore and learn about ancient cultures. Assessment will be completed in collaborative learning groups and through an individually assessed test. This course will help any students wishing to take Level 1 History. The course involves a one-day fieldtrip to the Auckland War Memorial Museum.

Course Cost: \$25.00 for a fieldtrip (optional but recommended).

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How to Enter Your Subject Choices on MUSAC Edge

STEP 1

- Go to <https://student.musac.school.nz>

STEP 2

- Login using your @my.waiuku-college.school.nz email address and password.
- If you have forgotten your password, enter your school email address and then click on 'Forgot Password?'. Go to your school email. Look for an email called 'MUSAC Edge Forgotten Password Request'. Follow the instructions in the email to reset your password.

STEP 3

- When you have logged into MUSAC Edge click on the 'My Summary' tab.
- Then click on the 'Options' tab.
- Make sure that you are looking at the options for 2021. If necessary, click on the 'NEXT YEAR' link at the top righthand side of the page.
- You will see a list of the courses on offer next year.
- To read a short description of each course click on the 'Info' link.
- To select a course, tick the box on the left-hand side.
- If you want to select a course from a different level use the 'Show courses for' drop-down menu at the top of the page.
- When you have finished selecting your courses scroll to the bottom of the page and click on 'Save'

What to do if you change your mind

- Repeat steps 1 to 3 above.
- To de-select a subject untick the box on the left-hand side and then click 'Save' at the bottom of the page.
- You can now select another subject. Remember to click 'Save' when you are done.
